

Kanha National Park

Kanha, 160 km southeast of Jabalpur, is one of the largest national parks in India. The total area of the park is 1945 km². In this region, rich in forests Salow, prairies, rivers and lakes, countless species of live animals. Here Rudyard Kipling Jungle Book settled share.

Already in 1933, the animals that live in the area covered partial protection. Status of Kanha National Park has gained only in 1955, The consistent policy of the authorities in the past 30 years there has been a significant increase in population of tigers, leopards, read, (swamp deer) (Indian bison). During the last census, conducted in 1997, count the 114 tigers and 86 leopards. The chances of seeing a tiger, gaura, or any of the representatives of the herbivorous species are quite large. In the park you can also carry out an interesting observation of avian populations. Kanha is completely closed to visitors during the monsoon, ie from 1 July to 31 October. Observations best conducted in March and April, when the animals leave the shadows and seek to place holes. The warmest months are May and June - afternoon temperatures rising up to 42 ° C. The coldest months are December and January. It is true, then the day is warm, but immediately after sunset the temperature drops to zero or below. Well-organized information centers are located in Kanha (the park), Khatii and Mukki. In all three exposures are equally interesting. The most impressive resort in Kanha, with five galleries, exhibition hall and a regular light and sound show, entitled Encounters in the Dark (Meetings in the dark). The main entrance is located in kisli, 3 km from Khatii. There shall be paid a fee for admission (200 INR; bring a camera / video camera, additionally 25/200 INR). Organizes trips to the park early in the morning or evening. In the park spaces to move vehicles at night. Executives mediates most hotels rent jeep. This is so much benefit that allows you to spread the costs over a larger number of participants. The fees depend on the mileage. Estimated cost is about 500 INR (up to six people), plus mandatory 90 INR per guide. For entry into the park to pay separately, once per day. In the peak season demand for jeeps is large, so you should think about booking soon after arrival. On the morning tour you take warm clothing. When choosing clothes, avoid brightly colored clothing. Inform the inscriptions in the tourist resort of Khatii. Persons who do not comply with this order may be fined.
